

- Up to 26 residents over 18 years of age from across the region will take part.

There is **no fee** to participate in the program.

Based on success in other programs we've run workshops could include:

- Self-leadership understanding yourself more, what motivates you and what you value.
- Adaptive leadership how this applies to community action projects, seeing change in the context of systems, the art of mobilising people for change.
- Resilient leadership how we cope with disruptions (like Covid-19/Climate Change) in positive ways to move towards a desired future.

We'd like to see the diversity of the region represented in the program's participants.


